
Upcoming Events for THS

BCCPC Conference

A year ago the Terrace Hospice Society was successful in their bid for a seed grant from the BC Centre for Palliative Care. This grant was to train volunteers to present Advance Care Planning Workshops in order to increase awareness and guide participants in the ACP process. THS sent two volunteers — Sue Skeates and Diana Wood to the training in Richmond. Since then they have presented numerous workshops in Terrace. These local workshops have been well attended and will be continued as long as there is interest.

As a result of this success the BC Centre for Palliative Care invited Sue and Diana to speak at the conference in Prince George in October. The audience were Hospice Volunteers who were new to presenting their own ACP workshops. Sue and Diana shared some of their successes and challenges to encourage them to step out of their comfort zone in order to share this important information.

The following day was the BC Hospice Palliative Care Association's Northern Regional meeting with diverse group of speakers. The Ministry of Community, Sport and Cultural Development

gave an interesting talk on the Community Gaming Grants Program.

Northern Health was on hand to do a presentation on Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) as well as Medical Marijuana.

The Houston Memorial Society spoke about the guidelines for those dealing with the death of a loved one and not wishing to use the services of a funeral home.

These meetings took place at the Rotary Hospice House and the participants were invited to take a tour of the facility. This beautiful house has a comfortable, friendly feel to it with 10 private rooms for guests as well as a large open dining concept kitchen for guests who are able to get up and around as well as their family and friends. There is a play room for the kids, a large meeting room, den and a bedroom for overnight visitors. The layout was designed to allow families to remain with their loved ones at all hours. It is our hope that one day soon Terrace will also have a Hospice House.

Our two volunteers were able to attend both events, take the tour of the Hospice House and they came back glowing with renewed enthusiasm.
