What is Hospice?

At Hospice we believe that no one needs to face their end of life journey alone. Hospice volunteers are wonderful people who aren't afraid to walk beside one another through the valley of the shadow of death and afterward through the wilderness of grief.

Hospice is an approach to care which:

- emphasizes comfort, quality of life and dignity to those approaching death,
- provides friendship and assistance from volunteers who understand the needs of patients and their families,
- affirms every persons right to die with dignity, and to be informed and involved in decisions affecting their care,
- enables terminally ill people to be cared for and die at home if desired,
- focuses on quality # living when cure is no longer an option


